PROGRAM POLICY

The West Hartford Public Library provides for the community programs that draw attention to and promote the unique resources of the library. Programs are an extension of the library's mission to serve as a center of information for all West Hartford residents, and are planned to highlight the informational, educational, cultural and recreational books and materials in the Library Collections.

Children's Programs

Programs are conducted for children of all ages and their families for the purpose of promoting reading and the use of library resources and services, broadening literary and language experience, and sharing the heritage of children's literature.

Programs, such as story hours, puppet shows, musical and craft programs, discussions, and workshops, extend the library experience beyond the written work in a social setting with other children and adults.

Adult Programs

A wide variety of programming is offered for adults of all ages, with priority given to programs that promote reading and literacy, the dissemination of information, and the appreciation of culture and the arts. Programs will be selected by the staff for their quality and their ability to encourage the use of library materials and services.
