

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Theme: ORANGE

We're looking for art that features the color orange, either as the main color, or in a composition where orange is used as a pop of color against a different color palette. Whatever the composition, orange should be a major part of the piece.

To submit: Send a clean, clear image of the art to kindspindesign@gmail.com from September 13 through September 20th. Email subject line should read: **Orange Submission**.

Along with the image of the artwork, please include: **Title, Framed Dimensions, Price** (or NFS if the piece is not for sale), and **preferred contact information**.

Artists may submit up to **three** pieces.

Artists will be notified if their piece(s) was accepted by Friday, Sept. 23rd.

Artist Eligibility: Artists 18+ living in CT

Show information:

Show Location: Noah Webster Library, 20 S Main St, West Hartford, CT 06107.

Drop -Off: Friday, September 30th from 4 - 6 pm at the Noah Webster Library Gallery. Artwork must be securely wired for hanging and framed (if framing is appropriate for that piece.) Also, please note: at this time we are only accepting pieces that can be hung on walls. There are no cases in the gallery to protect 3D art.

Show Dates: October 1 – November 30, 2022

Pick-Up: Wednesday, Nov. 30th, during library hours

Please read thoroughly BEFORE submitting to the show. By being part of the show you're agreeing to all the terms below.

It is the Artist's responsibility to get the art to the Noah Webster Library during the drop-off time. If they would like to deliver their art to an organizer early, there will be a fee of \$30 per day for storage and transport- cash payment is to be made when art is dropped off.

All Artists, by participating in the show, agree that neither the Library nor the WeHa Artists Emporium are responsible for damage done to the art.

The Artist is responsible for prompt removal of the art at the end of a show. If the art is still on the wall when the WeHa Artists Emporium prepares to hang the next show, the art will be stored at the library until the Artist can retrieve it.

The Artist understands that the gallery is in a government owned building, open to the public and agrees not to show any art that is violent, political, or graphic in any nature. Art that is deemed violent, political, or graphic in nature will not be accepted into a juried show.

The Artist understands that the library will not act as agents in the sale of the art. Contact information must be provided so that a patron can contact the artist directly. However, if a piece sells, it must still remain in the show until the pick-up date.

The library reserves the right to publicize the exhibit and related events. Permission to photograph and reproduce any work accepted in the exhibition for publicity purposes is considered granted, unless otherwise stated in writing.
