Theme: NATURE

We're looking for artistic representations of **nature**. The images *may* have humans, animals or architecture present, but the subject of the piece should be about nature and the beauty of the natural world. The art can be any medium (drawing, painting, photography, needlepoint, quilt, etc) that is 2-D and can be hung on a wall.

To submit: Send a clean, clear image of the art to juliephillipps@gmail.com from September 16 – September 22, 2023. Email subject line should read: **Nature Submission**.

Along with the image of the artwork, please include: Title, Artist name, Framed Dimensions, Price (or NFS if the piece is not for sale), and preferred contact information.

Artists may submit up to **three** pieces.

Artists will be notified if their piece(s) was accepted by Tuesday, Sept. 26th.

Artist Eligibility: Artists 18+ living in CT

Show information:

Show Location: Noah Webster Library, 20 S Main St, West Hartford, CT 06107.

Drop -Off: Monday, October 2nd from 1-3 pm at the Noah Webster Library Gallery. Artwork must be securely wired for hanging and framed (if framing is appropriate for that piece.)

Show Dates: Oct. 2 – Nov. 29, 2023

Pick-Up: Wednesday, November 29th, during library hours

Please read thoroughly BEFORE submitting to the show. By being part of the show you're agreeing to all the terms below.

It is the Artist's responsibility to get the art to the Noah Webster Library during the drop-off time. If they cannot make it at that time, they can either send a friend, family member, or communicate with the show organizers to arrange an alternative option.

All Artists, by participating in the show, agree that neither the Library nor the WeHa Artists Emporium are responsible for damage done to the art.

The Artist is responsible for prompt removal of the art at the end of a show. If the art is still on the wall when the WeHa Artists Emporium prepares to hang the next show, the art will be stored at the library until the Artist can retrieve it. (That said, the library is not your warehouse. Don't be rude. Pick up your art.)

The Artist understands that the gallery is in a government owned building, open to the public and agrees not to show any art that is violent, political, or graphic in any nature. Art that is deemed violent, political, or graphic in nature will not be accepted into a juried show.

The Artist understands that the library will not act as agents in the sale of the art. Contact information must be provided so that a patron can contact the artist directly. However, if a piece sells, it must still remain in the show until the pick-up date.

The library reserves the right to publicize the exhibit and related events. Permission to photograph and reproduce any work accepted in the exhibition for publicity purposes is considered granted, unless otherwise stated in writing.
